Today, I would like each of you to consider the following thoughts as we conduct training today as well as in the future and how that will prepare us for tomorrow’s challenges. As an enterprise, Global Mobility relies on four components: Airmen, equipment, infrastructure, and command and control. Each of these components make up nodes, which planners adjust to drive greater velocity and effectiveness throughout the enterprise. An adversary’s capability to restrict any component or our inability to execute due to a lack of preparation can jeopardize our ability to support air mobility operations.

A few days ago, the 62 AW launched seven aircraft to conduct Airland and Airdrop operations as part of Large Force Exercise (LFE) at the Mountain Home Range Complex. The Airmen who played a direct and indirect role in this LFE did an excellent job of executing a risk mitigated training plan with objectives that challenged each of those four components. We gained valuable insight on how those components excelled or failed during execution. I challenge each of you to explore where the limits are for these components during your training to provide an accurate assessment of our capabilities and limitations as an Airlift Wing. These assessments will only make us better and more capable of *Delivering Safe and Reliable Global Airlift*.
